Mobile phone safety

Law change for using your mobile phone whilst driving.

It is illegal to use a hand-held phone or similar device while driving, or riding a motorcycle - this is still the case stopped at traffic lights or queuing in traffic. It is also illegal to use a hand-held mobile when supervising a learner driver or rider.

New penalties now mean that motorists and motorcyclists caught using a phone while driving and riding will receive six penalty points on their licence and a £200 fine. This means that new drivers, within two years of passing their test, run the risk of losing their licence for a single offence.

<u>Keep safe</u> – put your phone away in the glove compartment.

School Comms

As from the summer term the only way you will be able to request a place in a club for your child will be via School Comms. This will help efficiency in the school office and save you the hassle of filling in forms and waiting to see if your child then has a place. We are also using this method to pay for dinners, trips etc.

It is very easy to do this once you download the app School Gateway from your app store (Android and iPhone). The app shows the same information as the website PLUS you can send app messages to the school for FREE – this will also save the school money when we send text messages.
