Wow! What a scorcher of a week. It has been incredibly hot in the school and I have been really impressed with how everyone has handled the heat. This week we had our Year 6 pupils' writing reviewed by an external moderator and it was a joy to see how detailed and exquisite the children's writing has become. Year 3 have been investigating what plant stems do and have been exploring an experiment to see whether coloured water will be transported up the stem of celery into the leaves.
