

Personal Social Emotional Development

- Continuing to develop independence
- Self-regulation to follow rules and routines
- Continuing to develop confidence to start sharing own ideas and talking about their experiences.
- Taking turns/friendships/sharing and caring
- Beginning to negotiate and solve problems without aggression.
- To begin to understand that people have different opinions.
- Self-confidence – able to talk about what they are good at.
- Playing in a group listening to others ideas and opinions.

Physical development

- Continue to develop fine motor control
- Begin letter formation following letters and sounds sequence
- Balancing
- Throwing and catching large balls

Dance

- Move with control and coordination
- Show awareness of space and others
- Move in different ways to music
- Build up short sequences/routines

- Listening and responding to stories

Art –

- Using lines to represent objects

Writing

- Measuring length using standard and non-standard measures
- Exploring ways to make amounts (eg) how many ways can we make 5
- Continuing simple addition and subtraction
- Recognising and describing 3d shapes
- Using positional language
- Reading the time to o'clock
- Making and continuing patterns
